

CAMP RULES

1. Be at least 20 minutes early. This is a good time for Walking Den Leaders to go through their Den Baggies for nametags and other information. It is also a good chance for Station Staff and other areas to get ready.
2. Late Scout arrivals and early Scout departures must be sent to Camp Headquarters before the Scout can join his den or leave Camp.
3. No boy will leave camp during the day without permission of the Camp Director and will be released only to the person or persons as directed by his parents IN WRITING. ***Please note that a phone call from the parent will not be sufficient to release the boy to another person!***
4. **All visitors must check in at camp headquarters as soon as they arrive.** Visitors will receive a unique name tag denoting that they are a visitor.
5. Walking Den Leaders are not to leave their den unless they still have 2-deep leadership.
6. All Scouts must follow the "Buddy System" from the time they check in until they leave Camp for the night. **NO ONE IS TO BE UNACCOUNTED FOR AT ANY TIME DURING CAMP.**
7. Any and all injuries, regardless of severity, must be reported to the First Aid Station each day.
8. All medicine must be in the original Pharmacy-labeled bottle. Scouts with inhalers or other medicine that must accompany them during Camp must check in with the First Aid Station each day.
9. The 2008 Camp T-shirt is the official uniform and must be worn at all times by everyone in Camp.
10. Sneakers, hiking boots or other closed-toe shoes and socks must be worn at all times. **No open-toe shoes in any camp including Lil' Scout Buddy Camp.**
11. **No running or throwing objects in camp**, except as part of an organized activity or game.
12. Hiking shorts, blue jeans or pants are to be worn. Please: no tight, very short shorts or cutoffs.
13. Personal toys, radios or similar electronic devices must be left at home. All such items will be confiscated and returned to parents at the end of the day's activities.
14. Scouts may **NOT** bring knives, including pocket knives, to Camp.
15. Only registered Girl Scouts or Boy Scouts 13 or older may be Red Shirts. Red Shirts will be assigned to specific duties by the Camp Director.

16. Jr. Staff are siblings of Scouts who have completed the 5th grade. Jr. Staff must stay with and assist their parents unless, with parental and Lil' Scout Buddy Director permission, they choose to work in Lil' Scout Buddy Camp.
17. Younger siblings will **not** be allowed to walk or ride with the dens. They must be checked in at Lil' Scout Buddy Camp. No strollers.
18. All participants, regardless of Camp or role, must be registered in advance of Camp.
19. Adults and Jr. Staff will **NOT** be allowed to do the crafts. Supplies are bought for the registered Scouts **ONLY**. Please do not ask to take supplies to someone. If a Scout misses an activity, he may have the supplies when he returns.
20. Packs should try to have 2 or 3 full-time adults who can be Walking Den Leaders. It's very confusing for Scouts if adults keep changing.
21. As leaders, remember that things are to be **FUN!** Do not make games into win-all competitions. Encourage boys to do their best and have fun.
22. As a volunteer at Camp, please help the boys show respect for our flag by reminding them to remove hats, stand quietly at attention and salute when told.
23. Please do not allow boys to stand on their buckets. This can be very dangerous.
24. Help boys to understand that "Signs Up" means to be quiet. Please lead by example.
25. Boys will remain with their Walking Den Leaders at the end of the day until their ride arrives and signs the Scout out with their Walking Den Leader. Parents may not wait in their cars for their Scouts.
26. Good behavior is a must for **EVERYONE** at Camp. No littering, bad language or inappropriate behavior will be tolerated. Be respectful of Bob Woodruff Park, its facilities and other people's property.
27. No swearing, obscene, or abusive language is permitted at the Camp.
28. No smoking is permitted at Camp.
29. No firearms or alcoholic beverages are permitted at Camp.
30. Remember to follow the Outdoor Code:

Be clean in your outdoor manners,
Be careful with fire,
Be considerate in the outdoors, and
Be conservation minded.
