

Walking Den Leader Job Description

1. All Day Camp Den Leaders are expected to attend the Pre-Camp meeting on May 17, 2008. Complete instructions and safety information will be provided at the meeting.
2. Be responsible to and follow directions of the Camp Cubmaster.
3. Arrive by 8:10 a.m. (a.m. session) or 4:10 p.m. (p.m. session) to set up your Den area before the Scouts in your Camp Den arrive.
4. Attend a brief Leaders' meeting (one adult from each Camp Den) with the Camp Director each day.
5. On the first day of camp, instruct the Scouts in your Camp Den in how the buddy system works and then assign buddies.
6. Keep attendance records and turn in to the Camp Director daily using the forms provided.
7. At least two adult Walking Den Leaders are required to remain with the boys in their Camp Den at all times (Two-deep leadership).
8. As scheduled, lead your Camp Den to the different stations in an orderly manner.
9. Assist Station Staff with the activities the boys are working on. Encourage and assist the boys.
10. Help the boys prepare a Den Cheer, Den Song (marching song), and a Den Flag. Maintain Den Spirit throughout the week.
11. At the end of each day, deposit trash in the large trash receptacle.
12. **At the end of each day, remain in the camp area until all the boys in your Camp Den have been picked up.** Return sign-in/sign-out folder to the Camp Director.
13. Always have another adult present when disciplining any child (two-deep leadership).
14. Bring any serious behavior problems to the Camp Director immediately.
15. If at any time any Scout needs any type of first aid, an adult is to escort the Cub Scout to the Camp First Aid Station.
16. Deliver your Lil' Scout Buddies (if any) to Lil' Scout Buddy Camp immediately

after the Opening Ceremony, pick them up to eat with you at lunch, and pick them up promptly at the end of each day's session.

1. If you have any problems or concerns with camp procedures, please bring them to the attention of the Camp or Program Director.
2. Go over the schedule with the boys at the start of each day.
